### **Initial Meeting Checklist**

Whether you are a new partner with REA Analytics, or we are collaborating on a new grant, the initial meeting is an opportunity to align goals, clarify roles, and set your organization on the path to funding success. To make the most of it, here's a quick checklist to help you get ready:

**1. Unique Entity Identifier (UEI) and SAM.gov Registration**

If your organization isn't registered with SAM.gov yet, this is an important step that should be done immediately. They are both required for all grant applications, and we recommend completing this step at least six weeks before submitting your proposal.

**2. Letter of Support**

Do you have partners supporting your grant application? Bring a letter of support from any collaborators offering critical services for the project. This adds credibility and strengthens your application.

**3. Team Member Involvement**

Identify which team members need to attend the meeting. Whether it's your program manager or financial lead, having the right people in the room ensures smooth coordination and clarity on responsibilities.

**4. Relevant Program Data**

Grants are all about demonstrating impact. Bring data that supports your application—whether it's past program outcomes, community needs assessments, or potential beneficiary statistics. REA can help visualize and structure this data for maximum effect.

**5. Questions for REA**

Got questions about the grant process? Unsure how responsibilities will be divided between

your organization and REA? Jot these down ahead of time so we can address them during the meeting.

## **Marriage and Relationship Education in 2025**

### *Your Guide to Funding Opportunities for Marriage and Family Initiatives*

This funding year includes various opportunities for organizations dedicated to promoting healthy marriages and relationships. The Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) announced several grant opportunities aimed at strengthening families and fostering lasting relationships. #### **1. Healthy Marriage Promotion Grant**

- Economic stability programs

The scope includes incarcerated fathers preparing to reunite with their families, ensuring they have the tools to build strong, supportive relationships. Whether your project targets the general population or specific demographics, this grant offers a diverse range of funding opportunities, with awards of up to \$1.25 million and an application deadline of May 1, 2025.
