Building Cross-System Partnerships for Stronger Programs



Map your system first: Identify opportunities for potential collaboration and address any gaps in your current program or offerings.



Engage partners early: Begin forming alliances and formalize roles and MOUs before drafting grant proposals.



Consider non-traditional partners: Discover organizations you have not previously engaged with, such as specialty courts, community-based organizations, transportation providers, and faith-based organizations.



Demonstrate value to partners: Clearly communicate how participation benefits each organization, from improved outcomes to access to funding opportunities.

Collaborative networks help address gaps, improve outcomes, and position programs for funding success.

Creating cross-system partnerships improves service delivery, which can lead to better participant outcomes, addressing unmet needs, and increasing program efficacy.

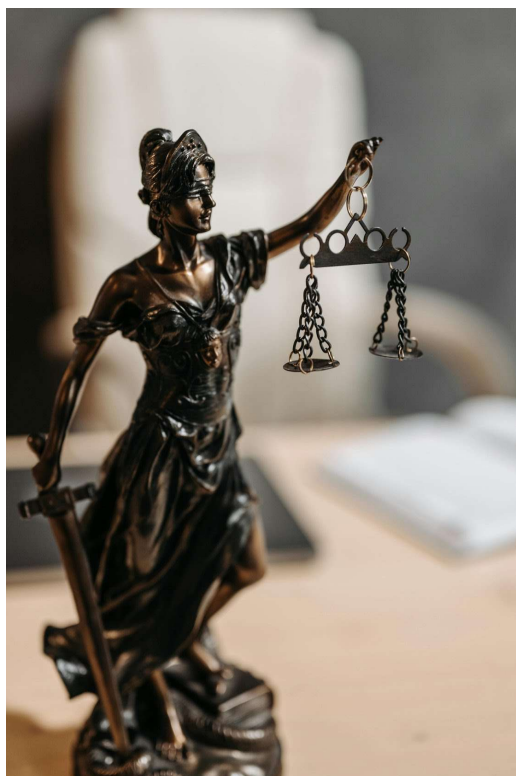

Mental Health Courts are Transforming Lives and Drawing Federal Support

The 2026 Funding Surge for Mental Health Courts

Untreated mental health conditions can manifest in poor judgment, extreme behavior, and, in some cases, criminal activity. Traditional courts were never designed to address these challenges, but mental health courts are different. They combined treatment, accountability, and coordinated support to transform lives, focusing on solutions rather than punishment.

The success of mental health courts is driven by the people behind them: judges who provide a balance of structure and compassion, court administrators who coordinate complex systems behind the scenes, and community partners who ensure accessible and effective care. These courts deliver measurable results; research shows participants have significantly lower rates of reoffending, with recidivism reduced by more than 40% compared to traditional court processing.

By connecting participants to tailored treatment, intensive case management, and ongoing clinical support, mental health courts stabilize mental health, reduce psychiatric hospitalizations, and decrease the need for emergency services.

As mental health courts prove their impact, showing up to \$3 saved in justice costs for every \$1 spent, federal funding for mental health and specialty courts has surged. This increase suggests that there will be more funding opportunities in the future for mental health courts, providing the resources needed to expand and strengthen partnerships between justice and behavioral health systems.

Key Federal Grants for Mental Health Courts

- **Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program – Local Formula**: Offers flexible funding for courts to improve treatment coordination, case management, and program services. Applications are due April 21, 2026, with awards up to ~\$5 million.

BJA FY25 Adult Treatment Court Program: Supports adult treatment courts in providing structured mental health and substance use programs, case management, and staff training. Applications are due April 27, 2026, with awards up to \$2.5 million.

BJA FY25 Veterans Treatment Court Program: Funds veterans' treatment courts to deliver specialized mental health services, coordinate with community providers, and enhance supervision. Applications are due April 27, 2026, with awards up to \$2.5 million.

BJA FY25 Comprehensive Opioid, Stimulant, and Substance Use, Site-Based Program (COSSUP): Supports prevention and treatment initiatives for individuals with substance use disorders. Mental health courts can use this grant to integrate substance use services, strengthen diversion programs, and improve outcomes for participants. Applications are due May 4, 2026, with awards up to \$7 million.
